

GUIDELINES TO AUTHOR FOR PUBLISHING RESEARCH PAPERS

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

Gujarat Journal of Extension Education is the official publication of Gujarat Society of Extension Education. It publishes original research paper in the field of extension education and allied fields.

General rules

The society has registered more than 1515 life members. The society is playing a significant role in providing a suitable forum for the exchange of ideas, encouraging research, and disseminating knowledge of extension education to the research professionals. The society organizes seminars, workshops, conferences, and various programmes at the national and international level on different topics of national importance. The society has also brought out several souvenirs and recommendations for the scientific community.

- The journal publishes full-length research article, short communication based on new finding/approaches and review articles in English only.
- The paper submitted for the publication in the journal should not contain material already published in any form, or even a part of it offered for publication elsewhere.
- Authors should submit a certificate duly signed by all authors to the effect that material contained has not been submitted elsewhere for publication.
- All papers are published after peer-review and after that approved by the Chief Editor.
- Submission of paper (through online http://www.gjoee.org/EditMsys.php#step-1 or offline with CD) does not guarantee its acceptance or publication in Gujarat Journal of Extension Education.
- All authors must be a member of the Society of Extension Education, Anand (Gujarat).
- Copy of the journal is provided free to all its members. Reprints of papers are not provided.
- The research paper should contain only three authors. The research paper contains more than three names will not be accepted for publication.

Preparation of manuscript

- 1) Articles should not exceed 15 double spaced typed pages, including references, tables, figures, etc.
- 2) Title of contribution should be short, specific, and phrased to identify the content in the article and include the nature of the study. It must write in running letters with first letter capital.
- 3) The names and initials of the place where the research was conducted should be given as the by-line. Any change in the address of correspondence address should be provided in a footnote. AUTHORS NAME should be in capital letters.
- 4) Paper may be outlined under the main heading- ABSTRACT, INTRODUCTION, METHODOLOGY, RESULTS, AND DISCUSSION, CONCLUSION if -any, -ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS, REFERENCES, etc. should be in capitals.
- 5) The manuscript should be submitted in duplicate typed in 12 pt Times New Roman in

- double space on A4 size paper with a minimum 3 cm left margin and Soft copy will be required at the time of submission of the revised document.
- 6) The abstract should not exceed 200 words. Key words up to six may be given beneath the abstract. Where the methods are well known, citation the of standard work would suffice.
- 7) Tables or graphics, wherever necessary, may support the result. Self-explanatory tables should be on separate sheets, with appropriate titles. While referring in texts, the first letter in Table and Fig. should be capital with Fig. in short form.
- 8) References should be cited chronologically in the text. All references in the text must be listed at the end of the paper, with names of the author arranged alphabetically; all entries in the text must correspond to references in the text.
- 9) The references should include the names of the authors, year, and the full title of the article, name of the journal, volume number, and pages. In the case of book and monographs etc. the name of publishers, place, and year with a total number of pages should also be given. Journal title should be italic in abbreviated form.

Check List

- 1) The manuscript is typed in double space throughout in 12 pt Times New Roman.
- 2) The title is written in running letters only.
- 3) AUTHORS NAME is capitalized
- Main heading (ABSTRACT, METHODOLOGY, RESULTS, AND DISCUSSION, CONCLUSION, REFERENCES, etc. are capitalized.
- (5) Sub-heading is left aligned.
- (6) Check all reference cited in the text is in the reference and vice-versa.
- (7) Give journal name in abbreviated forms in italic in the references.
- (8) Book title and report name are given in full
- (9) Tables and Fig are on a separate page and numbered in the order in which discussed in the text.

ETHICAL GUIDELINES FOR PEER REVIEWERS

Peer review in all its form plays an important role in ensuring the integrity of the scholarly record. The process depends to a large extent on trust, and requires that everyone involved behaves responsibly and ethically. Peer reviewers play a central and critical part in the peer- review process, but too often come to the role without any guidance and may be unaware of their ethical obligations. The COPE Ethical Guidelines for Peer Reviewers set out the basic principles and standards to which all peer reviewers should adhere during the peer- review process. It is hoped they will provide helpful guidance to researchers, be a reference for journals and editors in guiding their reviewers, and act as an educational resource for institutions in training their students and researchers.

Basic principles to which peer reviewers should follow

Peer reviewers should:

- 1. Only agree to review manuscripts for which they have the subject expertise required to carry out a proper assessment and which they can assess in a timely manner.
- 2. Respect the confidentiality of peer review and not reveal any details of a manuscript or its review, during or after the peer-review process, beyond those that are released by the journal.
- 3. Not use information obtained during the peer-review process for their own or any other person's or organization's advantage, or to disadvantage or discredit others.
- 4. Declare all potential conflicting of interests, seeking advice from the journal if they are unsure whether something constitutes a relevant interest.
- 5. Not allow their reviews to be influenced by the origins of a manuscript, by the nationality, religious or political beliefs, gender or other characteristics of the authors, or by commercial considerations.
- 6. Be objective and constructive in their reviews, refraining from being hostile or inflammatory and from making libellous or derogatory personal comments.
- 7. Acknowledge that peer review is mostly a reciprocal endeavour and undertake to carry out their fair share of reviewing and in a timely manner.
- 8. Provide journals with personal and professional information that is accurate and a true representation of their expertise.
- 9. Recognize that impersonation of another individual during the review process is considered serious misconduct.

Expectations during the Peer Review Process

On being approached to review

Peer reviewers should:

1. Declare if they do not have the subject expertise required to carry out the review or if they are able to assess only part of the manuscript, outlining clearly the areas for which they have the relevant expertise.

- 2. Only agree to review a manuscript if they are fairly confident they can return a review within the proposed or mutually agreed time-frame, informing the journal promptly if they require an extension.
- 3. Declare any potentially conflicting or competing interests (which may, for example, be personal, financial, intellectual, professional, political or religious), seeking advice from the journal if they are unsure whether something constitutes a relevant interest.
- 4. Follow journals' policies on situations they consider to represent a conflict to reviewing. If no guidance is provided, they should inform the journal.
- 5. Inform If, authors work at the same institution as any of the authors (or will be joining that institution or are applying for a job there); they are or have been recent (e.g. within the past 3 years) mentors, mentees, close collaborators or joint grant holders; they have a close personal relationship with any of the authors.
- 6. Review afresh any manuscript they have previously reviewed for another journal as it may have changed between the two submissions and the journals' criteria for evaluation and acceptance may be different.
- 7. Ensure suggestions for alternative reviewers are based on suitability and not influenced by personal considerations or made with the intention of the manuscript receiving a specific outcome (either positive or negative).
- 8. Decline to review if they feel unable to provide a fair and unbiased review.
- 9. Decline to review if they have been involved with any of the work in the manuscript or its reporting.
- 10. Decline to review if asked to review a manuscript that is very similar to one they have in preparation or under consideration at another journal.
- 11. Decline to review if they have issues with the peer-review model used by a journal (e.g. it uses open review and releases the reviewers' names to the authors) that would either affect their review or cause it to be invalidated because of their inability to comply with the journal's review policies.

During Review

Peer reviewers should:

- 1. Notify the journal immediately and seek advice if they discover either a conflicting interest that wasn't apparent when they agreed to the review or anything that might prevent them providing a fair and unbiased review.
- 2. Refrain from looking at the manuscript and associated material while awaiting instructions from a journal on issues that might cause the request to review to be rescinded.
- 3. Read the manuscript, ancillary material (e.g. reviewer instructions, required ethics and policy statements, supplemental data files) and journal instructions thoroughly, getting back to the journal if anything is not clear and requesting any missing or incomplete items they need to carry out a full review.
- 4. Notify the journal as soon as possible if they find they do not have the expertise to assess all aspects of the manuscript; they shouldn't wait until submitting their review as this will unduly delay the review process.

- 5. Not involve anyone else in the review of a manuscript, including junior researchers they are mentoring, without first obtaining permission from the journal; the names of any individuals who have helped them with the review should be included with the returned review so that they are associated with the manuscript in the journal's records and can also receive due credit for their efforts.
- 6. Keep all manuscript and review details confidential.
- 7. Contact the journal if circumstances arise that will prevent them from submitting a timely review, providing an accurate estimate of the time they will need to do a review if still asked to do so.
- 8. In the case of double-blind review, if they suspect the identity of the author(s) notify the journal if this knowledge raises any potential conflict of interest.
- 9. Notify the journal immediately if they come across any irregularities, have concerns about ethical aspects of the work, are aware of substantial similarity between the manuscript and a concurrent submission to another journal or a published article, or suspect that misconduct may have occurred during either the research or the writing and submission of the manuscript; reviewers should, however, keep their concerns confidential and not personally investigate further unless the journal asks for further information or advice.
- 10. Not intentionally prolong the review process, either by delaying the submission of their review or by requesting unnecessary additional information from the journal or author.
- 11. Ensure their review is based on the merits of the work and not influenced, either positively or negatively, by any personal, financial, or other conflicting considerations or by intellectual biases.
- 12. Not contact the authors directly without the permission of the journal.

When Preparing the Report

Peer reviewers should:

- 1. Bear in mind that the editor is looking to them for subject knowledge, good judgment, and an honest and fair assessment of the strengths and weaknesses of the work and the manuscript.
- 2. Make clear at the start of their review if they have been asked to address only specific parts or aspects of a manuscript and indicate which these are.
- 3. Follow journals' instructions on the specific feedback that is required of them and, unless there are good reasons not to, the way this should be organized.
- 4. Be objective and constructive in their reviews and provide feedback that will help the authors to improve their manuscript.
- 5. Not make derogatory personal comments or unfounded accusations.
- 6. Be specific in their criticisms, and provide evidence with appropriate references to substantiate general statements such as, 'this work has been done before', to help editors in their evaluation and decision and in fairness to the authors.

- 7. Remember it is the authors' paper and not attempt to rewrite it to their own preferred style if it is basically sound and clear; suggestions for changes that improve clarity are, however, important.
- 8. Be aware of the sensitivities surrounding language issues that are due to the authors writing in a language that is not their own, and phrase the feedback appropriately and with due respect.
- 9. Make clear which suggested additional investigations are essential to support claims made in the manuscript under consideration and which will just strengthen or extend the work.
- 10. Not prepare their report in such a way or include comments that suggest the review has been done by another person.
- 11. Not prepare their report in a way that reflects badly or unfairly on another person.
- 12. Not make unfair negative comments or include unjustified criticisms of any competitors' work that is mentioned in the manuscript.
- 13. Ensure their comments and recommendations for the editor are consistent with their report for the authors; most feedback should be put in the report for the authors.
- 14. Confidential comments to the editor should not be a place for denigration or false accusation, done in the knowledge that the authors will not see these comments.
- 15. Not suggest that authors include citations to the reviewer's (or their associates') work merely to increase the reviewer's (or their associates') citation count or to enhance the visibility of their or their associates' work; suggestions must be based on valid academic or technological reasons.
- 16. Determine whether the journal allows them to sign their reviews and, if it does, decide as they feel comfortable doing.
- 17. If they are the editor handling a manuscript and decide themselves to provide a review of that manuscript, do this transparently and not under the guise of an anonymous review if the journal operates blind review; providing a review for a manuscript being handled by another editor at the journal can be treated as any other review.

Expectation post review

Peer reviewers should:

- 1. Continue to keep details of the manuscript and its review confidential.
- 2. Respond promptly if contacted by a journal about matters related to their review of a manuscript and provide the information required.
- 3. Contact the journal if anything relevant comes to light after they have submitted their review that might affect their original feedback and recommendations.
- 4. Read the reviews from the other reviewers, if these are provided by the journal, to improve their own understanding of the topic or the decision reached.
- 5. Try to accommodate requests from journals to review revisions or resubmissions of manuscripts they have reviewed.

PLAGIARISM OR SIMILARITY CHECKING

As per SEEG norms, Gujarat Journal of Extension Education checks the similarity report of Article. All the Research Scholars are requested to send their report in full and single pdf excluding bibliography/references to seeganand@gmail.com. The size of PDF should not exceed 5 MB and not more than 15 pages.

Guidelines for checking and acceptance criterion

Exclusion of material while checking

- All quoted material
- Matches up to 10 words
- All material (i.e. figures/images and tables) used with the permission of the original sources
- Bibliography

Acceptance Level

- Introduction and literature review portion up to 15%
- Remaining Material up to 10%
- Overall similarity index should be less than 15%

ETHICS POLICY

The publication of an article in a peer-reviewed journal is an essential building block in the development of a coherent and respected network of knowledge. It is a direct reflection of the quality of work of the author and the institutions that support them. Peer-reviewed articles support and embody the scientific method. It is therefore important to agree upon standards of expected ethical behaviour.

Ethics topics to consider when publishing:

- (1) Authorship of the paper: Authorship should be limited to those who have made a significant contribution to the conception, design, execution or interpretation of the reported study.
- (2) Originality and plagiarism: The authors should ensure that they have written entirely original works and if the authors have used the work and/or words of others that this has been appropriately cited or quoted.
- (3) Data access and retention: Authors may be asked to provide the raw data in connection with a paper for editorial review and should be prepared to provide public access to such data.
- (4) Multiple, redundant or concurrent publication: An author should not in general publish manuscripts describing essentially the same research in more than one journal or primary publication. The SEEG does not view the following uses of a work as prior publication: publication in the form of an abstract; publication as an academic thesis; publication as an electronic preprint. Information on prior publication is included within each SEEG journal Guide for Authors.
- (5) Acknowledgement of sources: proper acknowledgement.
- (6) Disclosure and conflicts of interest: All submissions must include disclosure of all relationships that could be viewed as presenting a potential conflict of interest.
- (7) Fundamental errors in published works: When an author discovers a significant error or inaccuracy in his/her own published work, it is the author's obligation to promptly notify the journal editor or publisher and cooperate with the editor to retract or correct the paper.
- (8) Reporting standards: Authors of reports of original research should present an accurate account of the work performed as well as an objective discussion of its significance.
- (9) Hazards and human or animal subjects: Statements of compliance are required if the work involves chemicals, procedures or equipment that has any unusual hazards inherent in their use or if it involves the use of animal or human subjects.
- (10) Use of patient images or case details: Studies on patients or volunteers require ethics committee approval and informed consent, which should be documented in the paper.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY

1. INTERPRETATION

In these Rules and Regulations unless there be anything in the context repugnant or inconsistent therewith.

- a) The Society shall mean the society registered under the name of "Society of Extension Education, Anand (Gujarat)".
- b) The Executive Council shall mean the Executive Council of the Society constituted by provided by these Rules and Regulations.
- c) Words imparting the singular number shall be deemed to include plural and vice-versa.

2. MEMBERSHIP

- a) Membership shall be open to all individuals and institutions actively interested in the field of Extension Education. Any such individual or institution may become a member by paying the membership fee
- b) There shall be six classes of members:
 - Life Member
 - Corporate (Institutional) Member
 - Student Member
 - Patrons Member
- c) The number of Honorary members shall not, at any time, exceed two per cent of the total number of life, ordinary and corporate members. Such membership shall be restricted to person eminent for their contribution to Extension Education.
- d) Honorary members shall be selected on the unanimous recommendation of the Executive Council.
- e) Any student in a University, College, Technical School or Research Institute when vouched for by the Head of his Institution may become a student member of the society on payment of prescribed fees.
- f) The annual membership fee shall be as follows: -

1. Life member (India) ₹ 3500/-

2. Life member (Overseas) \$50/-

3. Corporate/Institutional member ₹ 6000/- for 10 years

4. Patrons (Individual or Institutional) ₹ 10,000/-

g) Each member of the Society shall be bound by the provisions of the Memorandum of Association of the Society and these Rules and Regulations and by all the rules, regulations and decisions from time to time made by the society in General Meeting or by the Executive Council.

3. THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

- 1) There shall be an Executive Council, which shall carry on all the affairs of the society between the annual meetings. The Executive Council shall act according to the general policy laid down by the Society. The activities of the Council will be subject to review at the following annual meeting of the society.
- 2) All the Directors of Extension Education and HoDs of Agril. Extension and Communication Department of SAUs (HQ) of the Gujarat shall be the members of the Executive Council as ex-officio.
- 3) The Executive Council shall consist of President, Vice President, Secretary-cum-Treasurer, Joint Secretary, Chief Editor of the Journal and executive councilors (including Directors of Extension Education or HoDs of Agril. Extension and Communication Department (HQ). The-total members of Executive Council shall not exceed fifteen, the executive members by virtue of Rule-2- are exempted from the election. Remaining, members shall be elected from the members.
- 4) The term of the office of the Executive Council of the Society shall be for a period of three years.
- 5) The time of retirement of the office bearers shall be immediately after the election of the new office bearers.
- 6) In the event of any vacancy arising among the members of the governing body or executive council by resignation or death or leaving India permanently or in any other manner as hereinbefore provided, such a vacancy shall be filled by the President from among the members of the society and such a member shall be member of the executive council till the period of the executive council's tenure.

4. PROPERTY AND INCOME

- a) All properties both movable and immovable and all securities belonging to the society shall vest in the society by its President and Secretary-cum-Treasurer or Vice-President and Secretary- cum-Treasurer; and all properties to be acquired in pursuance of the objects of the society shall be acquired in the name of the society by the President and Secretarycum-Treasurer or Vice- President and Secretary-cum-Treasurer.
- b) The property and income of the society shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the object of the society as set forth in the Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of bonus or otherwise however to the members of the society.

5. POWERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

The Executive Council shall have the entire control and management of the work and affairs of the society, and do all such things to carry out generally the objectives of the society as are by the societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 not required to be exercised or done by the Society in General Meeting. The Executive Council shall also have power from time to time to make vary and repeal rules and regulations for the transaction and regulation of the business and affairs of the society and of itself. The Executive Council shall have and exercise, mainly

through the Secretary all the powers necessary to carry out the management of the society. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, the Executive Council shall have the following powers:

- a) To the same extent as natural persons might or could do to acquire purchase, lease, mortgage, loan, gift grant, legacy bequest, exchange, right or otherwise from any person, company, society, government or institution or anybody whatsoever movable and immovable properties of all descriptions deemed necessary or useful for any purposes of the society.
- b) To lake or to receive any gift, whether money or property, movable or immovable donations in the form of debentures, stocks, shares or securities in any company or society, whether incorporated or not or whether by gifts by a person living or by legacy bequest will or foundation and whether subject to any, special trust or not for any or more of the objects of the: society or for works connected therewith and to take steps such as personal visits, appeals in writing etc., for the securing of such contributions for the funds of the society as may from time to time be deemed expedient according to law.
- c) To alienate by way of sale, mortgage, lease, release, loan, charge, hypothecations, pledge, exchanges, hiring gifts or otherwise with or without security the properties of funds of the society or any portion or portions thereof according to law.
- d) To negotiate with and to enter into arrangements with any Government or authority, whether central, state, district, municipality, local board or university or other public or private body as may seem conducive to the promotion or accomplishment of the objects of the society or any of them and to apply for, obtain, collect, receive or recover from any such Government or authority or body such grants, allowances, rights, concessions and privileges as may seem from time to time desirable and to carry out exercise, comply and utilise the same.
- e) To borrow money or receive money on deposit upon such terms and with or without mortgage or other security charged on all or any property funds, assets, rights or privileges of the society as the Executive Council shall deem necessary or expedient and to repay the same.
- f) To promote, maintain control give or lend money or other properly or assistance to and conduct support or subscribe to any societies associations, companies whether incorporated or not having objects altogether or in part similar to the objects of the society.
- g) To invest, lay aside, deposit in Banks or otherwise deal with the monies or funds of the society not immediately required for the objects of the society and to subscribe for purchase, acquires, hold, sell, endorse and negotiate in every way debenture stocks; shares and securities of every description on the money market.
- h) To open and operate on current, overdraft, savings or fixed deposit accounts with any Bank or Banks on such terms and in such terms arid in such manner as the Executive Council shall deem fit and that such Executive Council jointly or severally or by any persons appointed for the purpose by the Executive Council even though they be not members of the society.
- i) To make, draw, executive, accept, endorse, negotiate, buy, sell, transfer pledge and otherwise deal with bills of exchange, promissory notes, cheques, bills of lading, railway

- receipts of insured letters or parcels, postal receipts and other negotiable commercial or transferable instruments or securities.
- j) For any of the purpose aforesaid to employ and procure the assistance of and to suspend, discharge and dismiss personnel or staff either for remuneration or gratuitously and on such terms as the Executive Council may deem fit.
- k) To provide for the welfare of persons employed by or connected with the society and their dependents, by establishing and contributing to benefit funds and giving allowances or grants of money or loans or otherwise as the Executive Council shall think fit.
- I) To establish, maintain, control, conduct and close down institutions, branches, representations or agencies of the society in such places—and on such terms as the Executive Council may from time to time deem expedient or necessary.
- m) To commence, prosecute, defend, appear, to conduct, compromise abandon contest or submit to decree, order or judgment any civil, criminal, administrative, revenue. municipal; arbitration, conciliation or other proceeding or enquiry for: the furtherance of or in conjunction with any of the objects or functions of the society and to engage and remove experts, doctors, lawyers, accountants and others for any of the purposes of the society on such terms as the executive council shall deem fit.
- n) To appoint such person or persons as the Executive Council may deem fit for the purpose of representing the society and/or the Executive Council in any legal or other proceedings to be instituted by or against the society.
- o) To appoint and; remove and to delegate all or any persons of the Executive Council to such committee or committees consisting of such member or members of the Executive Council and/or others as the Executive Council may from time to time deem necessary and/or expedient.
- p) Generally, to do all such other things as may be deemed by the Executive Council to be incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the above objects.

6. MEETINGS AND QUORUM

- a) The Executive Council shall meet at least twice a year and shall transact such business as they may deem fit and also such business that persons in charge of the institutions or activities of the society may place before them. The President or in his absence the Vice President shall convene all meetings of the Executive Council at such time and place as he may deem fit.
- b) A quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Executive Council shall be the President or Vice- President and at least two other members of the said Executive Council of the society provided that a circular resolution in writing or any other document of whatsoever nature signed by a quorum of the Executive Council in accordance with the provisions of these presents shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution, passed at a meeting of the Executive Council duly convened and constituted and such a resolution shall not be deemed in valid by reason of want of notice or of vacancies for the time being in the Executive Council or for any other reason whatsoever.

- c) The annual meeting of the Society shall be held once in a year in the month of July or as near thereto as possible, for the following purposes:
 - (i) To receive the report of the Executive Councils the accounts of the Society and the auditor's report for the year ending June 30 next preceding the date of the meeting.
 - (ii) To check the current membership roll.
 - (iii) To appoint the auditors for the year and to fix their remuneration.
 - (iv)To transact any other business which may be brought forward by any member of the Executive Council or by any member of the Society with the previous permission of the President.
- d) The Executive Council or the President may call an Extraordinary General Body Meeting of the Society whenever in their or his opinion they or he may deem it necessary to do so.
- e) The quorum at all General Body Meeting of the Society shall be five members personally present. If within half an hour from the time appointed for holding meeting of the Society a quorum is not present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to such other day and at such other time and place as the President or Vice-President may determine. If at the adjourned meeting also a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed, for holding the meeting the members present shall form a quorum and all business shall be validly transacted.
- f) At all meetings of the Society or the Executive Council, the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall be the Chairman and every member present shall have one vote. In case of absence of both the President and the Vice-President those members present shall appoint one from among themselves as Chairman of the meeting. All resolutions unless otherwise stated in these Rules and Regulations will be carried by a simple majority of votes, the Chairman, however, will have a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes.
- g) All acts done by the President or Vice-President or by any meeting of the Executive Council or of a Committee or by any person acting as a 'bonafide' representative of the Council shall notwithstanding that it be discovered afterwards that there was some defect in the appointment of any such members or persons as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person or officer had been duly appointed and qualified.
- h) The Council through its Secretary or any other appointed member, shall maintain the record of all meetings, the register of membership and all other records required by law, and keep accounts of income and expenditure; and these accounts shall be audited by a Registered Chartered Accountant as prescribed by law. The accounting year of the Council will end on March 31.
- i) Donation policy: All the GB members unanimously decided that efforts should be made for voluntary declaration of awards by members / nonmembers / organization / institution / company for UG & PG students and faculty. The awards condition are as under:
 - (1) ₹ 50,000/- for individual's name award

(2) ₹ 1,00,000/- for organization / institution / company's name award

7. AMENDMENTS

These Memorandum of Association of the Council and these Rules and Regulations and any rules and regulations hereafter made by the Society may from time to time be varied, added to or revoked by a majority of not less: than three fourth of the members of the Society present; at a General Body Meeting called for the purpose of such variation, addition or revocation, provided that in the case of any alteration, extension or abridgement in the purposes of the Society or its amalgamation with another Society or the dissolution of the Society, the provisions of Section 12 and I4 of the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 shall apply.

8. DISSOLUTION OF THE SOCIETY

Should the dissolution of the Society be found necessary from whatever cause in accordance with Section 13 and 14 of the said Societies Registration Act, if any property or assets remain over after the satisfaction of; his debts and liabilities the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the Members of the Society or any of them, but shall be given to some other Society which shall be determined by votes of not less than three-fifths of the Members present, personally or by proxy, at a General, Body Meeting convened for the said purpose.

9. Nothing herein laid down shall invalidate any action taken in good faith, merely on account of a technical irregularity of procedure.




